Hotel El Convento, where our classes are held, is a landmark monument to the Conquistador Age. 356 years ago it was a Carmelite convent; thus, the Spanish Colonial architecture and design

In 1646 construction began on the Carmelite convent through a petition by King Phillip IV of Spain. In July 1651, the convent was inaugurated as the Monastery of Our Lady Carmen of San José and was situated across the street from San Juan Cathedral, the Western Hemisphere's oldest cathedral.
